
Letter from the Editor





Diane Waters Wheatenridge Kennel 1941 - 2025

It is with sadness that I write of the passing of one of the club's founding members.



Diane Waters of Wheatenridge Kennel left us suddenly on August 4th 2025. Born in St. Albans, England in 1941 she married her childhood sweetheart in 1963 before moving to Canada in 1967. Diane was a career elementary school teacher and her passion for teaching and education spilled over into her passion for purebred dogs. Diane was always willing to invite new people into the breed and always eager to share her love of Rhodesian Ridgebacks.

A long time Canadian breeder of Rhodesian Ridgebacks, Diane obtained her first Rhodesian Ridgeback in 1967, later purchasing her foundation bitch in the early 80's from Dianne Miller and John Glover (Roughrider). Diane and Rob (known to many of as Bob) established Wheatenridge Kennel, breeding many champions over the years. Rob passed from cancer in 1994, and Diane then moved to Iona Station. She continued breeding for a few more years, briefly breeding whippets as well, before retiring to the village of Strathroy for her remaining years.

Over the decades Diane volunteered countless hours to both her breed and all breed clubs in various roles, and also was dedicated to organizing and supporting junior handling. She held many picnics, obedience and sanction matches, and truly enjoyed bringing people together to socialize, play team games and have fun with their dogs on her acreage.

The RRCEC Best of Breed trophy is the Wheatenridge Perpetual Trophy. Donated by Diane and Rob it will hopefully continue to keep their memory alive and their enthusiasm to continue to celebrate this wonderful breed in the club in years to come.

Godspeed Diane, may you find Rob waiting for you with all your dogs at the Bridge.

Puppy Socialization

Socializing puppies with kids properly is essential for both the safety of the children and the healthy development of the dog. Here's why it's so important:

1. Builds Positive Associations

Early, positive experiences with children help puppies associate kids with fun, affection, and safety. This reduces the risk of fear-based behaviors like growling, hiding, or snapping later on.

2. Prevents Aggression

Dogs that aren't socialized with children may see them as unpredictable or threatening. Proper socialization reduces the chance of future aggression or defensive behavior.

3. Teaches Puppies Boundaries

Socialization gives puppies a chance to learn how to behave around small, energetic humans. They learn not to nip, jump, or play too rough.

4. Teaches Kids Respect and Handling

Children also learn how to approach and handle a puppy gently and respectfully. This helps prevent accidental injuries to both the dog and the child.

5. Encourages Adaptability

Well-socialized puppies grow into dogs that are more adaptable in family environments, including homes with children or visiting nieces, nephews, or friends. They're less likely to be stressed in loud or busy situations.

6. Supports Mental Health and Confidence

Exposure to children during the puppy's critical socialization period (usually up to 16 weeks) helps build a confident, well-adjusted dog. Lack of exposure during this window can lead to anxiety and fearfulness.

Tips for Proper Socialization:

- Keep interactions supervised and positive.
- Use treats and praise to reward calm behavior around kids.
- Start with calm, gentle children before introducing to louder or more energetic ones.
- Teach kids how to approach dogs calmly, pet gently, and respect the puppy's space.




